SSES Celebrations:

- Increased overall enrollment
- Implementation of **SEL curriculum** (including restorative circles and Sanford Harmony) and adjustment of **bell schedule to accommodate SEL time**
- With MTSS committee, development in progress of schoolwide community norms (safety, respect, responsibility) and expectations for behavior in various environments. Development and implementation of new PE/recess and schoolwide intervention forms
- **Designation of Safety and Security TOSA (Karen Pierro)** and updated safety protocols at dropoff and pickup times.
- Increased office hours for attendance/preschool, increasing safety, communication, and customer service
- Pilot of new math curriculum
- Increased inclusion of students in special education and increased collaboration between special education and general education teachers

SSES Areas of Focus:

- Curriculum: Continue research and pilot of language arts and math curriculum.
- MTSS: Consistent communication and implementation of schoolwide expectations and interventions
- **Special Education:** Develop definitions and schoolwide approach to SpEd services. Continue support for co-teaching environments including training, collaboration, shared understanding and goals among staff, and appropriate support and services for students
- School Schedule: Continue to maximize opportunities for small-group support and enrichment and access to extracurricular "specials" aligned with 21st century skills and standards
- Class sizes in TK-1 band exceeding contractual "target"
- **Designation of funds** (Sanford Harmony Grant)
- Maximize access to clinical counseling (individual, small group, whole class lessons) and MFLC
- **Facilities**: Clean up of excess rooms and storage spaces, discard of obsolete resource materials, provide shade in outside learning and snack spaces
