A Classified Substitute Orientation was held on Wednesday, April 5<sup>th</sup>. 5 new certificated substitutes were added bringing our total to 129.

Salary Surveys were completed and submitted to the San Diego County Office of Education for Certificated, Classified and Management positions.

We are currently planning the CUSD Retirement Celebration which will be held at the June  $6^{th}$  CUSD Board Meeting.

# **Information Technology: Jason Ramos, Network Supervisor**

CAASPP testing has gone well in April. The IT department continues to monitor bandwidth to ensure a good testing experience. A few items of note:

- After intensive testing, the IT department has made a recommendation for the vendor/model of security cameras to be installed at the front door of each school site. The cables for each camera have been run in each location so as soon as the cameras are purchased/received, they can be installed.
- The IT department has performed site walkthroughs at CMS, Silver Strand Elementary and Village Elementary to look at spaces that need additional speaker coverage for announcements. We are working with our vendor to provide the most cost-effective way to cover the areas in need.
- For the month of March there were 14 new tickets and 79 were closed. There are currently 40 open tickets.

# **Student Services: Niamh Foley, Director**

### **HERE Now Program**

Counselors from the **HERE Now Program** were on campus at CHS for two weeks in March in partnership with South Bay Community Services. **HERE Now** provide prevention and early intervention services to middle and high school to address and decrease rates of suicide within our adolescent population. Data collected from their visit indicate:

- 1095 of our students received the presentation.
- 114 students were assessed by a counselor. The students were self identified, flagged by a counselor during a presentation, or identified by other students. Several students reported concerns regarding other students throughout the two weeks.
- 10<sup>th</sup> graders were most identified as high or moderate risk.
- 26 of the 114 students assessed were identified high risk, with one who was sent to the hospital and currently in a treatment facility. Safety plans were completed for all these students, some had not be identified before by our staff. CHS staff and counselors followed up with these students again the following week.
- 30 of the 114 students assessed were identified a moderate risk. Identified students were reviewed by counseling team.
- 58 of 114 students assessed were identified low risk. Identified students were reviewed by counseling team.
- All 114 students were given our directory of resources and crisis hotline numbers.

Counselors from HERE Now will return to CMS next month for one week to provide prevention and early intervention education to our middle school students. Our clinical counseling team worked closely with the South Bay Community Services counselors and report the program was a tremendous success. Plans are already in the works for their return in the Fall.

**kNOw MORE** is a comprehensive and engaging program based on the latest sex trafficking research in San Diego and developed in collaboration with experts from Point Loma Nazarene University in partnership with the San Diego Office of the District Attorney. The curriculum was designed to help young people recognize the red flags and vulnerabilities around trafficking and equip them to take action for themselves and their peers. The ultimate result would be the prevention and eradication of this injustice in San Diego County. The Soroptimist International of Coronado presented a demonstration of the program on April 7th in the Black Box Theater and a pilot of the program will be presented at CHS on May 2nd.

## **Program Specialist**

Katie Leontieff joined the Student Services team on April 1st as our new Program Specialist. Katie will serve in a collaborative role to support the implementation of MTSS across the district through collaboration with general and special education staff for the development, implementation, and operation of instructional, behavioral and socio-emotional supports for all students. #### **CPI Trainer**

VES teacher, Michael Connor, was recently certified in CPI's Nonviolent Crisis Intervention Foundations Program.
